

How to Prove Your Status as a Retired NFL Football Player

Some Settlement Class Members have received Notices of Incomplete Registration indicating that we do not have information showing that they qualify as a Retired NFL Football Player under the Settlement Agreement.

To meet the criteria, you must have been a player on any roster, including preseason, regular season, or postseason of any Member Club of the NFL, or in the American Football League, World League of American Football, NFL Europe League, or NFL Europa League, but no longer under contract or seeking active employment as a player, as of July 7, 2014.

If you received such a Notice, send to us any paystubs, media reports, game day programs, or other documents that show you meet the definition of Retired NFL Football Player.

If you are unable to find sufficient documentation, call us at 1-855-887-3485 or email ClaimsAdministrator@NFLConcussionSettlement.com for assistance. A lawyer representing Settlement Class Members should call or email his or her Law Firm Contact.

Do not contact the NFL or a Member Club directly to ask for records. We will research the situation further and ask the NFL Parties for any records the NFL or a Member Club may have and then get back to you.

To request that we help you find employment and participation information, provide us:

1. The team(s) for which the potential Retired NFL Football Player played;
2. The season(s) the potential Retired NFL Football Player played; and
3. Whether the potential Retired NFL Football Player was on an active roster or practice/developmental/taxi squad.

You will not receive a Notice of Adverse Registration Determination while this research is ongoing. If we are unable to obtain sufficient records through these efforts, you will be afforded additional time to provide the necessary proof.
