REVISED REGISTRATION RULES AND FAQs

NATIONAL FOOTBALL LEAGUE PLAYERS' CONCUSSION INJURY LITIGATION No. 2:12-md-02323 (E.D. Pa.)

On January 29, 2018, we first announced the Rules Governing Registration Appeals, which became effective on January 26, 2018. The Special Masters have approved additional rules about Registration in the Rules Governing Registration Determinations and Appeals now posted to the <u>Rules</u> page on the Settlement Website. This is what has changed from the previously-posted version of these Rules:

- 1. Rule 3 now defines "Family Member," "Late Registration," "Order Approving Centralized Process" and "Registration Deadline."
- 2. Rule 6(c) includes a provision that permits the Claims Administrator to extend any deadline that does not concern actions by the Special Masters.
- 3. There are two new sections named "Registration Review by the Claims Administrator" (Title II) and "Late Registrations" (Title III). Title II (Rules 7-9 on pages 5-6) covers our initial Registration reviews and how we evaluate challenges to those determinations. Title III (Rules 10-17 on pages 6-8) explains the Registration deadline, how we determine whether there are grounds to accept late registrations based on a showing of good cause and the challenge rights associated with those determinations.
- 4. Rule 19(c) (formerly Rule 7(c)) now allows the NFL Parties to appeal to the Special Masters a Notice of Registration Challenge Determination on the issue of whether a registration was timely.

We also updated Registration FAQ numbers 30, 31, 32 and 35 to refer to the new Rules.
